**INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S LIMITED REVIEW'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

Opinion

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of Shera Zambia Limited which comprise the Balance sheet as at 31 March 2025, and, statement of profit & loss account and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

In our opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Shera Zambia Limited as of 31 March 2025, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standard for Small and Medium Entities and accounting principles generally accepted in Zambia under the Companies Act 2017.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (Parts A and B) (IESBA Code) and other independence requirements applicable to performing audits of financial statements in Zambia. We have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the IESBA Code and in accordance with other ethical requirements applicable to performing audits in Zambia. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Key Audit Matter

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgement, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide an opinion on these matters.

Other information

The directors are responsible for other information. The other information comprises the directors' report as required by the Companies Act 2017, which we obtained prior to the date of this report. Other information does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express an audit opinion or any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

Responsibilities of the directors for the Financial Statements

1. Principal activity

The company is incorporated in Zambia and its principal business activities involved in Manufacturing of Non-ferrous Metal Products.

2. Basis of preparation of the financial statements

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a). Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"). The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IFRS requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires directors to exercise judgement in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies.

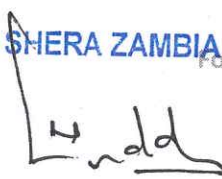
The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future.

The validity of this assumption depends on the director being able to generate sufficient funds.

If the company were unable to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future, adjustments would have to be made to reduce the statement of financial position values of assets to their recoverable amounts, to provide for further liabilities that might arise and to reclassify fixed assets and long-term liabilities as current assets and liabilities.

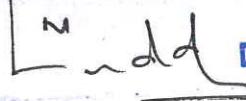
